



High performance trail tracks

Modern snowmobile tracks provide far more performance for the buck than the old timers, and changing your track can be an easy performance upgrade. Performance tracks have also become much more specialized, so you can better match the new track to the way you ride. But first you have to examine what you really want and need before selecting a track as a performance upgrade. And you must consider that no track can be the best at everything. As one performance parameter is maximized, something else will be compromised.

For instance, tracks with more aggressive tall lugs will provide a better bite in fresh, deep, or loose snow, and that better bite means better acceleration and braking. But taller lugs also increase weight and aerodynamic losses, factors that work against the track at higher speeds, so top speed will be decreased a bit compared to tracks with shorter lugs. Some tracks are engineered to have exceptional lateral bite to provide great stability and excellent cornering, but that can also limit the fun of sliding the rear end through the corners.

The key is to carefully examine where you ride, how you ride, and what you want a track to do better before choosing your track upgrade. That's why we offer so many different performance tracks and why we say that Camoplast has the right track for the way you ride.
