



Cobra™ versus RipSaw™

Sometimes it's hard to decide which track is the right track for the way you ride. For instance, if you have a late model performance sled and want a track upgrade, the Camoplast RipSaw™ and Cobra™ tracks are top choices. And while both will provide a performance boost, there are some real differences between them.

The staggeringly popular RipSaw is a very aggressive track with angled track lug profiles to provide an excellent traction for straight ahead acceleration and braking as well as plenty of lateral bite for precise, predictable, nailed-to-the-trail handling in a wide variety of snow conditions. The narrow lug base and slotted design reduce rolling resistance to make more efficient use of available horsepower, and the hard rubber outside edges allow for increased durability and traction. Available in a wide variety of sizes and TRACKtion Control models for studding, the RipSaw remains the benchmark for trail performance tracks.

The Cobra is the next generation high-performance track for trail sleds. Featuring an innovative lightweight lug design with an extended cutting edge for improved bite on hard pack, the unique Cobra-scale carcass and cupped lugs also produce excellent traction and performance in soft, loose snow without sacrificing the top end. Offering improved acceleration over the RipSaw with comparable top speeds, the Cobra preserves the fun of sliding the back end while maintaining excellent control and superior forward traction on the trail.
